Our greatest need right now is for maternity clothes. We would welcome any size and need dresses, pants or shirts. We always have a need for wipes, baby lotion, powder, shampoo or baby oil and, of course, diapers. Baby furniture, such as cribs (with all the parts), bassinets, high chairs and strollers are always welcomed. Due to current laws, we cannot use car seats unless they are brand new.

We strive to serve God by giving Him our best at Hope Women's Center—spiritually, physically and emotionally. When the women/girls come through our doors, we want to furnish them and their babies with the best items possible. That means we prefer new or very gently used clothing. Thank you for helping us to do this. Your donations are what keep us ready and able to supply some of the needs of the youngest members of Pickens County.

Legislation

Two bills have been introduced in the South Carolina Senate relating to the "personhood" of the unborn.

S0083 and S0087 amend the Code of Laws to establish that "the right to life for each born and preborn human being begins at fertilization and the rights of due process and equal protection begins at fertilization." While both of these bills were introduced a year ago, neither of them has gotten out of the Senate Judiciary Committee. If these bills are to pass this session, they must be voted on before May. Both of these are good bills and would go far to protect the life of the unborn child in SC. Please let your legislators know that you would like to see them passed.

A Sacrifice of Truth

Did you know that some people who are proabortion will admit that the unborn baby's life began at conception?

Earlier this year, commenting on the 1973 proabortion decision by the U.S. Supreme Court, *Roe v. Wade*, a journalist admitted that while she is proabortion, she believes life indeed starts at conception. (1) At the same time, she said that the unborn baby is "a life worth sacrificing."

The journalist admitted that life begins at conception, but was still willing to support abortion. Sadly, many people like her will say that the mother's selfish interests should trump the baby's life.

Evolutionist Richard Dawkins once wrote that an unborn baby is not as important as an adult pig⁽²⁾.

Psalm 139 tells us that God formed our inward parts and "knit us" together in our mothers' wombs. The Psalmist declared that we are "fearfully and wonderfully made," and God told the prophet Jeremiah that he knew Jeremiah before he formed him in the womb.

As we think about the 41^{st} anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*, we need to remember that God's Word says

that each individual has value, even before conception.
